



• **Protest meeting today** **THE 'OUTCASTS'** **COME TO TOWN**

The "outcast" Davis aboriginal family (pictured) was brought to Sydney by the Methodist Church yesterday to take part in a protest against racial discrimination in Australia.

They will appear on stage while three speakers address the public meeting at Lyceum Theatre, Pitt St., City, today.

Speakers will be the Rev. Alan Walker, the Rev. C. F. Gribble and the Rev. R. G. Pearson of Nambucca.

The Davis family arrived in Sydney yesterday after an all-night trip from Nambucca in Mr. Pearson's car.

Earlier this year the Davis family tried to buy a house in Palla Rd., Nambucca, but 26 people in the town signed a petition protesting against the sale.

One of the petitioners forestalled the Davises by buying the house, a four-roomed unpainted cottage, for £400.

The protest meeting will try to raise money to build the Davis family a house in Nambucca.

A fund begun a month ago has already raised £600 of the £1700 needed.
