The 13-year-old girl from the tiny Riverina township of Barellan won another two titles in the N.S.W. junior hardcourt championship.

Although conceding age to her opponents, Miss Goolagong won both the under-15 singles and doubles.

She has now won six N.S.W. titles in two years.

In completely out-classing Wendy Gilchrist in the under-15 singles final, Evonne

displayed the potential which has prompted critics to acclaim her as a better player than Margaret Smith at the same age.

The slimly built youngster with a flashing smile brought roars of applause from the crowd of more than 500 watching the final.

Evonne domina te d the match, displaying a complete range of shots and uncanny courcraft for such a youngster.
