dressed in black and wearing black armbands, should stage a silent protest against Captain Cook bi-centenary celebrations.

"Added to her proposals we want banners and placards," Mr McGuinness said. "We want the Queen to

see them.

"They will read: 'Cook is Bad News,' 'Aboriginals Refused Land Rights,' 'Aboriginals—a Race of People Without A Country,' and 'Aboriginals'

Identity Lost.'

"We are hoping for a nonviolent demonstration but whether they are going to allow us to have one is another story."
