Don't be cuckoo — Bolte

Anybody who took notice of the three aboriginal land rights campers in Sherbrooke Forest would be "cuckoo", the Premier, Sir Henry Bolte, said today.

The camp leader, Mr Lin Onus, 22, a part aboriginal, said yesterday a self-supporting aboriginal colony would be set up in the forest — a national park — in a few weeks.

Mr Onus said he and his friends were prepared to go to jail in the campaign for aboriginal land rights.

Fines for occupation of public lands are \$40 for the first offence, \$100 for the second and \$200 for the third.
