reject West' From ALAN ROWE

SYDNEY. - Aboriginals are looking to

communist countries for guidance in their approach to selfdetermination, aboriginal leader, Mr Bruce McGuinness, said today.

He told 200 school teachers and academics: "Aboriginals are rejecting capitalist values and are looking towards China, Cuba and Russia as catalysts for the liberation of the aboriginal people." Mr McGuinness addressed the Australian Teachers' Federation convention at the Uni-versity of New South

Wales. Speaking on the subject "Problems on aboriginals," he said the few well educated aboriginals in Australia had become an "educated elite and a black bourgeoisie." "This elite among abor-

iginals is as oppressive to-

wards our black people as the white controllers of our community are," Mr McGuinness said. He said that even ten fold growth of the numbers of educated aborig-inals would not benefit the black people, and it would only enlarge this

"elitism." "The system is allowing the privilege and benefits of higher education to the few, and denying the aboriginal people their right for advancement as

a whole community. stood on like they are dead bugs, and if they do not want to be stood on they have to become like the people who are now oppressing them." he said.
