In a message conveyed to the NACC Mr Dexter said the decision had been made "in view of the quite outrageous treatment of staff made available".

Staff members who had attended the NACC meeting to participate and offer advice had not been given a hearing and had been expelled from the meeting, he said.

Mr Dexter denied a statement by the NACC's president. Mr Jim Stanley, that he had refused to attend the meeting and talk with representatives. He had received no direct request for a meeting, but had told NACC members that he or his relevant staff members would meet delegations of up to three people at the department.

Mr Stanley had not apoken to him since they had south Africa and its overall policy towards that country, has been passed by the committee.

Trade with South Africa and Rhodesia should be discontinued, shipping should avoid South Africa and Qantas should discontinue its services to that country the committee said.

It also called for postal and telecommunications services to be cut and the removal of all South African and Rhod esian offices in Australia.
