

Man tells of Valium

SYDNEY, Friday. —
A man who had described himself as an Aboriginal revolutionary told Central Court today he had taken 16 Valium tablets because of strain at work before he committed a series of offences outside the High Court last year.

Mr Denis Bruce Walker, 29, of Mount Tamborine, near Brisbane, an administrative officer of the Aboriginal Community Health Service, pleaded guilty to a charge of possessing a .22 calibre rifle outside the High Court in Darlinghurst on June 10 last year.

He also pleaded guilty to two charges of using unseemly words and to a charge of resisting police.

Mr Jones, SM, placed Mr. Walker on a \$300 good-behaviour bond for two years for carrying the rifle and fined him a total of \$140 for the other offences.
